Other notable attendees were Mark Bowen who played country cricket for 8 years with Notts and Northants, his best 1st class figures being 7-73 for Notts v Somerset in 1998, Martin Hood who is Redcar's top amateur century maker, others who had travelled from far and wide included Steve Coates from Thailand (hat-trick v Preston in 1997) steady opener JVG Clements from Manchester and one of NYSD's highest wicket-takers of all time Col Bainbridge who also played Minor County Cricket for Durham from 1969-1971, now living in Harrogate, and Mark's brother Graham Bowen (161 no v Stokesley in 1999) now working in Australia.
