

Redcar CC - Results Summary

The 1sts played Marton at home and they made 152-9. Pro Mohammed Zahid taking 6-35. We made a poor start at 31-4 and were bowled out for 92. The following week we made 179-8 v Stokesley at home. Saad hit 51 Tyler Easton 43 and Ziddy a cavalier 31 not out. Stokesley struggled against the tight bowling of Ziddy 3-20 off 17 overs finishing on 156-8. The following week we played Guisborough and came close to victory chasing 184 (Saad 6-62) we made 179-7 Ziddy smashing 49 no.
