We have started our 1st X1 2012 campaign with 4 straight wins under new Skipper Steve Hutchinson. We beat Darlington 2nds by 7 wkts and Tom Urwin enhanced his reputation as one of the leading batsman in Division One with a fluent 105 not out. This was followed by wins at Yarm and at home to Whitby. Highlights of these games were veteran Mick McCabe's 4-21 v Yarm and Mike Rix's 6-26 v Whitby. Opener Ollie Rodgers has had an amazing start with 4 consecutive fifties. He was only out once so his average is a remarkable 270. Skipper Hutchy also contributed flamboyant knocks of 60 and 43 in these wins. We then beat Yarm at home who made 154, and the ageless Mick McCabe again rolling back the years with 3-27, new boy Ben Hutchinson took 2-26 and Mitchell Brown 2-17.
