**1<sup>st</sup> XI's** vital September campaign began with an easy victory over Blackhall who made 158 all out. Veteran Mick McCabe the pick of the bowlers with 5-43, ably supported by Adam Pickard with 4-16. Tom Urwin 94 not out and consistent Tyler Easton with 38 not out saw us home by 8 wkts. We then thrashed Marske by 152 runs. Tom (72) and Ollie (106 not out) put on 162 opening partnership in our 229-3 declared. Jonathon Cooper had a little cameo innings of 25 not out. Marske were bowled out for 77 with Ben Hutchinson the pick with 3-7. After Bishop Auckland's draw at Saltburn this meant we had to beat Whitby away to get promoted which we did by 3 wkts as mentioned on page 1.

**The 2nds** had an exciting draw with Maltby finishing on 194-9 chasing their 206-9. Man of the Match was skipper Ben Hodgson who followed his 3-38 with a knock of 61 not out. Youngsters Danny Jones and Davey Corps took 3-48 and 3-60 respectively. We then beat Middlesbrough by 103 runs. We made 199-6 with Billy Hodgson top score with 39 not out. Boro could only muster 96 all out against the mercurial spin attack of Rob Munro (4-38) and Jonathon Cooper (5-20). This meant the 2nds finished in mid table of Division 2.

Skipper Ben Hodgson capped a fine season with 300 runs and 19 wkts. Other star performers were Steve Lee with a century, Rob Munro, 16 wkts and the intrepid Davey Corps 15 wkts and 33 lbws turned down but impressively appealed for.

**The 3rds** hammered Great Ayton who made 87 all out with Rob Munro taking a career-best 9-16. We struggled early on and were 13-4 before Craig Potter steered the ship home with 50 not out sharing a 70 run partnership with Skipper Keith Munro 34. They then had a winning draw v Normanby Hall after Veteran Andy Wetherell made 96 before being bowled due to heat exhaustion and fatigue on the warmest day of the year. Last game of the season was rained off after Richmond hit 234-3, we were 66-2 (Rob Munro 32 not out) before 2012's arch enemy arrived on cue.

Star performer for 2012 was Rob Munro with 344 runs and 29 wkts closely followed by Craig Potter with 218 runs and 23 wkts. Jonathon Cooper smashed 295 runs and Andy Wetherell marked his comeback at the end of the season with 188 runs averaging 62 in his 4 innings.

Ollie Rodgers had an outstanding season hitting over 1,000 runs in all competitions including 845 in the league. Tom Urwin hit 724 league runs and Tom and Ollie's average opening partnership was an impressive 69.
